Students who are currently enrolled, or have graduated within the last year (Fall 2016/ Spring 2017) from a design program in British Columbia are eligible. Scholarships will be awarded on the strength of the solution, and how effectively it communicates a message, benefits a community, affects action and promotes change.

- Exported and received within one PDF (3-5 pages)
- A maximum file size of 15MB total
- For print, please include concept drawings, mood boards, photographs of finished work. For interactive submissions, please include screen captures AND must include a valid url
- Displayed on tabloid page (landscape) with a .5" margin (download the template online)
- Proof of enrollment or graduation within the past year (Fall 2016/Spring 2017) in a BC design program
